✦ From Toronto and points east:

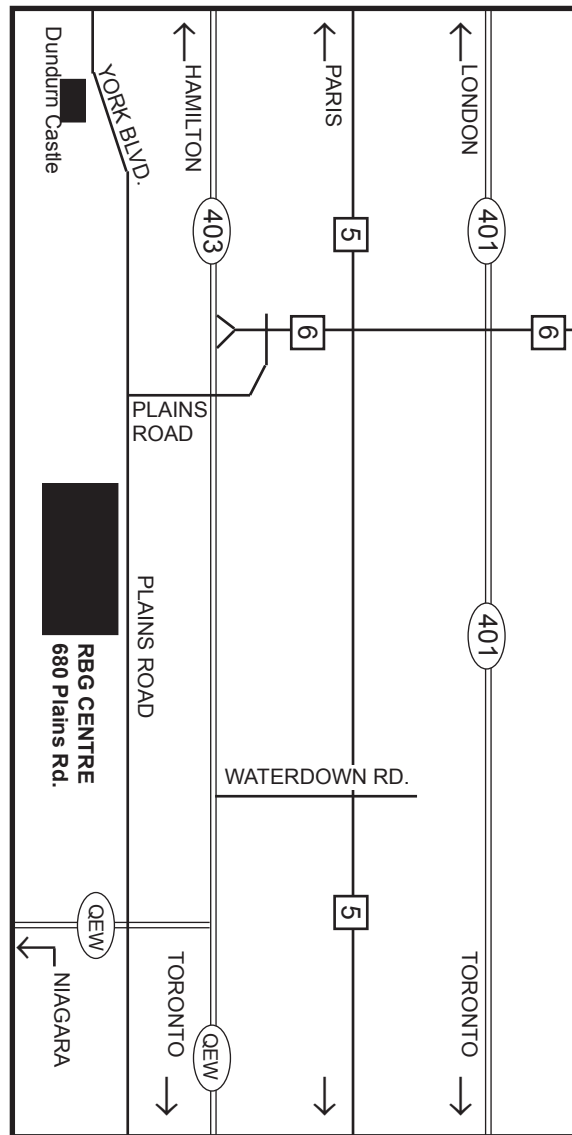
Follow the Queen Elizabeth Way, westbound to Highway 403 west. Follow the signs for Hamilton/Brantford. Exit at Hwy. # 6 north. Turn right at the first traffic light (Plains Road). Turn left at the next traffic light (Plains Road again). The RBG Centre is approximately 1 km. on the right hand side.

✦ From Niagara, Lewiston and Buffalo:

Follow the Queen Elizabeth Way past Hamilton, cross the Burlington Skyway bridge. Exit at Plains Road; turn left at the traffic light and watch for RBG signs. The RBG Centre is approximately 6 km. west.

✦ From London, Windsor and Detroit:

Follow Highway 401 (McDonald Cartier Freeway) east, take exit 299 (Highway 6 south), follow the signs for Hamilton. Exit left onto Plains Road West (last traffic light before junction of Highway 403.) Turn left at the next traffic light (Plains Road again). The RBG Centre is approximately 1 km. on the right hand side.
