Thursday November 15, 2012

9am-12pm **Hot Pots for Cool Seasons**, Tim Walsh and Liz Klose

This talk on pots begins by using the principles of thrillers, fillers and spillers in a live design demonstration of a wild winter container. Inspirational, 'hot' show-stopping winter and spring containers to accent the entrance of your residence or corporate office will be featured. This presentation will spark your imagination to add colour and flare to your new pot design concepts and plant combinations.

Thursday January 10, 2013

9am-12pm **The Propagation and Landscape Uses of Native Newfoundland Plants**, Todd Boland

This presentation will introduce Landscape Newfoundland and Labrador industry members and home gardeners alike to the many native Newfoundland plants, both woody and herbaceous, that have landscape value in today's urban plantings. Suggestions on where in the landscape they may be used and propagation techniques will be discussed.

Thursday May 9, 2013

9am-12pm **Pruning**, Tim Walsh, Todd Boland and Carl White

This workshop will discuss the how, when and why of pruning as well as how pruning can be used to direct plant growth. Specific pruning techniques for individual woody plant 'groups' (eg. conifers, flowering shrubs, hedges, etc) will also be presented.

All workshops take place at MUN Botanical Garden, Mount Scio Road, St. John's. Participants should come prepared with gloves and basic gardening tools. Some portions of the workshops will take place outside, and so participants are encouraged to dress appropriately. Safety boots are recommended but not required.



Workshop Presenter Biographies



Liz Klose, BSc (Agr), CLP; Director

Liz is the present Director of Memorial University of Newfoundland's Botanical Garden (MUNBG), and Landscape Priorities Manager with the Landscape Canada Committee of the Canadian Nursery Landscape Association. Liz is the former Superintendent of the Niagara Parks Commission School of Horticulture, where she began as an Instructor/Curator and taught plant identification, soils, plant health care, plant propagation, fruit and vegetable culture; and practical skills as Instructor/Curator of the Herb, Vegetable, Perennial, Ornamental Grass and Rose Gardens. Recipient of the 2006 Ontario College Horticulture Educator of the Year Award by Landscape Ontario, and an Honour Roll Award and Spirit Award from the Ontario Parks Association Foundation in 2008.

A co-author of two gardening books: *Roses for Ontario*, and *The Best Garden Plants for Ontario*, Liz is a Certified Landscape Professional (CLP), an Honourary Master Gardener of Ontario, a member of the Perennial Plant Association and the Herb Society of America.



Tim Walsh, O.D.H.; Nursery Manager

Tim started at the Garden in 1989. He is responsible for all levels of propagation for MUNBG and all aspects relating to the management of the MUN Botanical Garden Nursery. He also manages a production greenhouse on campus supplying a wide variety of plants for use in Biology teaching labs. Tim teaches a variety of workshops at the Garden, works closely with the F.O.G Horticulture group, and is a regular on CBC Radio's Gardening Crosstalk.



Todd Boland, B.Sc., M.Sc.; Research Horticulturist

Todd is involved in a variety of research projects at the Garden from invasive alien plant species, care of our ex situ rare Newfoundland plant populations to breeding and selection of new hardy plant varieties. Todd is also a prolific writer and lecturer on plant-related topics. He is the current editor of our newsletter, *The Twinflower*.



Carl White, Head Gardener

Carl started at the Garden in 1988. He is responsible for the planning, care and maintenance of all the planted gardens in the Botanical Garden. Carl teaches a variety of workshops each year and supervises a small crew of summer student employees. Carl also assists the Friends with the Wildlife-Friendly garden.
